Inequities in Vaccination Among Blacks and Latinos

Black and Latino New Yorkers are far less likely to have gotten the coronavirus vaccine than white residents, according to data the city released for the first time Sunday. Among New York City residents who have gotten their first vaccine dose, 48 percent are white — compared to 32 percent white residents in the city population overall. Black residents are 11 percent of vaccine recipients, compared to 24 percent of the population. Latino residents are 15 percent of vaccine recipients and 29 percent of the population. Read the data.

All vaccine appointments that were cancelled due to Monday's snowstorm will be rescheduled. Vaccinations reopened today at hospitals only.

Live/Work Eligibility for Vaccine

Vaccines are available to New York State and NYC residents only. Current patients of NYC Health + Hospitals must be a resident in New York State in order to be eligible. New patients must live or work in one of the five boroughs of New York City to be eligible. Proof of residency is required when they come to their appointment.
