

Travel Screening – Inpatient Nurse

To prevent the spread of infections, all patients should be screened for recent travel and/or contact with anyone who has traveled recently. H2O will require the Travel History screening to be filled out once per day for any patient presenting to an H+H hospital or clinic. The Inpatient Nurse should review the Travel Screening from the Admission Navigator to ensure all questions have been answered.

Try It Out:

- Select the Admission tab within the Navigator Activity
