COVID-19:

Cleaning and Disinfecting Electronic Devices



This guideline provides recommendations for cleaning and disinfecting electronic devices.

Definitions:

- + Encased Devices: Electronic devices (tablets, phones) with a protective case
- + Un-encased Devices: Electronic devices (tablets, phones) without a protective case
- + Accessories: Chargers

Procedure:

- 1) Don new gloves.
- 2) Inspect device. Ensure there is no visible soil (body fluid, dust, or organic matter). If present, use a wipe to remove all visible soil.
- 3) For <u>encased devices and accessories</u>, use a disinfectant wipe to disinfect the hard, non-porous surfaces. Do not use bleach.
 - For <u>un-encased devices or surfaces</u>, use 70% isopropyl alcohol wipe to disinfect hard, non-porous surfaces such as the display, keyboard or other exterior surfaces. Don't use bleach. Note:
 - Avoid getting fluid or moisture into the speakers or charging port.
 - Consider placing a wipeable cover or screen protector on the device.
- 4) Surfaces must stay wet for the time required per product label.
- 5) Allow to air dry completely.
- 6) Dispose of wipes and gloves.
- 7) Perform hand hygiene.
