

Message from Chief Medical Officer Coronavirus Update

As the news about COVID-19 – also known as the novel coronavirus – continues to evolve, we know that there are many questions and concerns about what this means to our health system, our patients and our families. As of today, there's only one confirmed case of coronavirus in New York City. NYC Health + Hospitals has activated our expert emergency management and response operation to help us prepare in case the virus becomes more widespread. And we are taking assertive steps to ensure we have the plans, guidelines and resources in place to provide safe care to anyone who may present with COVID-19. We also continue to coordinate with the City and State Departments of Health and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to bring you the most timely and reliable information.

Because this is a rapidly evolving situation, we are sharing a number of updates related to COVID-19, including an update to our travel warning and clinical criteria and guidelines for the appropriate use of N-95 respirators/masks which are in high demand worldwide and requires us to conserve and extend our available supply.
