**All tests are nasal swabs**, which is a cotton or foam swab inserted in your nose.

Please bring your insurance card if you have insurance. If you do not have insurance, you can still get tested.

You will not have to pay for the test. If you have insurance, we will bill your insurance, but at no cost to you.

**You will not be asked about your immigration status.**
