

COVID-19 Live Update

January 6, 2021



- Administered over 13,000 doses to date
- Significantly expanded eligibility to NYC H+H workforce members based on NYS DOH guidance
- Currently providing vaccination appointments at all acute care sites and 6 Gotham locations
- Expanding to provide vaccination to unaffiliated health care workers in the community
- Continuing to identify additional vaccination locations for community members

Eligibility for COVID-19 vaccine now includes those who:

- Work in an acute care facility/hospital or clinic/FQHC/Gotham where I may have direct or indirect contact with COVID-19 patients or infectious materials or the general public.
- This includes any volunteer, vendor, affiliate, or employee working in an acute care hospital or FQHA including Metroplus outreach staff.

OR

Eligibility for COVID-19 vaccine expanded to those who:

- Work at any NYC Health + Hospitals or T2 location(s) where community testing, treatment, support or outreach to patients or clients is performed.
- This includes any volunteer, vendor, affiliate, or employee or temp working in hotels, doing outreach, working in community testing tents and community care.

OR

Eligibility for COVID-19 vaccine expanded to those who:

- Are a NYC Health + Hospitals essential employee supporting the provision of care at our health care facilities whose current job responsibilities require full-time or part-time in-person work.
- For central office, this includes individual who are working in-person at least part time. This excludes those who are telecommuting full time. This includes employees who work on the provider side of Health + Hospitals, not Metroplus.

Staff Questions & Answers



Q: I have bad allergies. Is it safe to get a COVID-19 Vaccine?

A: Some people have experienced severe allergic reactions—also known as anaphylaxis—after getting a COVID-19 vaccine. CDC recommends the following regarding severe allergic reactions:

- If you have ever had a severe allergic reaction to any ingredient in a COVID-19 vaccine, CDC recommends that you should *not* get that specific vaccine.
- If you have had a severe allergic reaction to other vaccines or injectable therapies, you should ask your doctor if you should get a COVID-19 vaccine. Your doctor will help you decide if it is safe for you to get vaccinated.
- People with a history of severe allergic reactions not related to vaccines or injectable medications—such as allergies to food, pet, venom, environmental, or latex—may still get vaccinated.
- People with a history of allergies to oral medications or a family history of severe allergic reactions, or who might have a milder allergy to vaccines (no anaphylaxis)—may also still get vaccinated.
- If you have a severe allergic reaction after getting the first shot, you should not get the second shot. Your doctor may refer you to a specialist in allergies and immunology to provide more care or advice.

Q: I want to get tested for COVID-19. Where should I go?

A: Health + Hospitals staff are prioritized for testing at our acute care hospitals and Gotham Health sites.

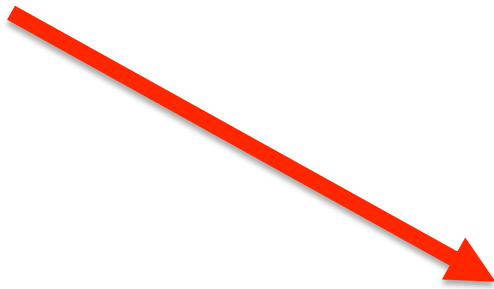
