

COVID Surge Transfer Evaluation Workflow – Receiving Facility Command Center


This tip sheet breaks down the new COVID-19 Surge Transfer workflow, which includes a new **Inpatient Consult to Surge Transfer Evaluation** order. In anticipation of another surge of COVID cases, a core Central Office team will assist with monitoring whether COVID patients are eligible for transfer and help facilitate the transferring of these patients from one facility to another within the enterprise.

A member of the receiving facility's command center will monitor the patient's surge transfer progress and status of the ambulance transportation arrangements.

 The staff member at the chosen receiving facility will have to change departments and log into the HHC SURGE TRANSFERS [58] to access the appropriate Surge Transfer Evaluation system list.



2. The staff member will see all patients accepted to their facility by referring to the following system list folder path within Available Lists: Surge Transfer Evaluation → Surge Transfer Evaluation Accepted → Accepted – [receiving facility name].





3. All inbound surge patient transfers will be listed (note: transfers facilitated through the Transfer Center for specific services or higher level of care requests will not be included). This list includes basic patient demographic and clinical information, as well as columns dedicated to the patient's Surge Transfer Acceptance Status and an indication if the Ambulance Transportation has been arranged or not.



- 4. Once patients land onto this list, a physician at the receiving site or Central Office has already confirmed that patient's acceptance. Receiving Command Centers should use this list to partner with Admitting for bed assignment and Nursing for awareness of inbound transfers.
- 5. Once the bed has been assigned, it is recommended to reach out to Hunter Ambulance, NYC Health + Hospitals' Ambulance vendor, with the bed assignment so that the patient is not brought to the Emergency Department. Hunter dispatch can be reached at **(718) 991-2211**.
- 6. If the circle in the "Surge Transfer Eligibility Status" turns red or black this patient is no longer eligible for transfer and will not be transferred to the receiving facility. Transportation will be cancelled by the Central Office Level-Loading Team.
